

Payment plan of old Ninnekah 911 bill discussed

- The check isn't in the mail yet, but a plan for the Town of Ninnekah to pay Grady County for back E-911 services is being discussed.

Attorney Scott Tack met with Commissioner Mike Lennier and Sheriff Art Kell about paying the bill, Lennier said at the commissioner's regular Monday morning meeting.

Lennier also said that the topic of drawing up a written agreement with the Town of Ninnekah has been discussed with Stephens County Assistant District Attorney Chip Garrett.

Tack told commissioners Monday that Kell advised Ninnekah is \$3,200 behind in payments. The plan is to pay \$1,600 up front and to pay the remainder within 60 days, he said.

Footnote:

As of October 6 the city of Ninnekah has full dispatch service. Sheriff Kell has notified Chief Miller all dispatch services will resume to full coverage.
