

RURAL CITIZENS MAKE ARREST ON 2 BURGLARS

On Monday February 21 at around 3:30 pm a call was placed to Chief Investigator Gary Journeycake from a citizen. A citizen called saying "we have two women stealing property from Steve Nunley's farm house." Immediately deputies were dispatched to 744 CR 1580. Upon arrival Deputies, Police and State Troopers saw several men standing around a white Chevrolet pickup occupied by 2 women loaded with misc. property. Citizens told deputies they saw the 2 women loading a dish washer into the back of the vehicle from the house. As soon as the men pulled into the driveway, the women jumped into the pickup and tried to exit the property. The 2 women was told not to leave, but tried to force their way through. Several other businessmen and farmers arrived to assist their neighbors and wait for law enforcement to arrive. Sara Howard 29 and Brandi Camp 27 were placed under arrest by Deputy April Seaton on Burglary 2 charges. Joshua Camp who is Brandi's husband came to the scene and was placed under arrest on warrants out of Caddo County. All 3 where transported to the Grady County Jail. After the arrest was made, the citizens were thrilled with how they all worked together communicating with the Sheriff's Department. One of the good citizens said; "this is a victory for the good law abiding people in the Rush Springs area. This is good community policing by all the residents that are tired of thugs stealing their hard earned property. I feel that we as citizens are fed up with thieves and justice needs to be served." "I asked both women have they heard about the war on crime around the Rush Springs Area; they just looked at me crying," stated Sheriff Art Kell. The description of the vehicle has been linked to other burglaries around the Rush Springs area.
